Welcome to the first issue of ChapeltonNews in 2016.

With more than 65 homes now occupied, over 80 sold or reserved, the completion of Hume Square and the demand for properties continuing, the year is off to a promising start.

Just one month into 2016 and we have already received a visit from Chapelton's master planner, Andrés Duany, a global pioneer of new urbanism - an urban design movement which promotes walkable, mixed-use communities that act as an alternative to conventional suburban developments.

Marking his first visit to Chapelton since the construction of Cairnhill, the first neighbourhood within Chapelton, began - it was an opportunity for him to see his vision become a reality.

Homes in Cairnhill already include flats, terraced houses, semi-detached and detached properties. Community facilities, such as Teacake, are emerging and becoming established as hubs for residents and all within walking distance of their new homes.

We are pleased that our architectural vision to combine local building heritage with interiors designed for modern living have been applauded by the local press recently for tastefully retaining the local character. In addition, they offer enviable green credentials when it comes to energy efficiency and carbon reduction.

Offering a wide range of property types is of great importance to us at the Elsick Development Company and to each of the three housebuilders. In response to demand for single-storey homes, housebuilder Stephen will shortly begin to develop a number of mixed-sized cottages in the next stage of the town. These properties will not only bring new styles of homes to Chapelton but will provide a type of accommodation that many visitors over the past year have asked us for.

Christmas Service

The new community came together and celebrated its first Christmas in the town by attending a local service on Sunday 20th December led by Chapelton resident and member of St Ternan's Ministry Team, George Masson. The hardier residents gathered, on a very blustery night, at Chapelton and 'enjoyed' a torch lit procession down the Causeymouth to the church.

Over 120 residents and neighbours enjoyed the very festive service at St Ternan's before enjoying a sociable gathering with a selection of seasonal treats and mulled wine.

The service also raised more than £300 for the local renal unit in Stonehaven which provides support to patients requiring dialysis and kidney treatment.

Woodland Planting

Following the successful community tree planting last July, a second woodland planting is planned for 17th April 2016. This will allow residents, who have not taken part already, the opportunity to come together to mark their arrival in the community and plant more trees in the community woodland area.

The Chapelton Community Wood is part of 25-acres of green space in the development and will be a lasting legacy for local residents and those living in neighbouring areas.
