The Chapelton Bike Ride Challenge on Sunday 4 September was a huge success with hundreds of residents pedalling-up the miles in aid of local charity North East Sensory Services (NESS).

Over £6000 of much needed funds were raised for the charity by cyclists who took on the 12 and 42-mile routes over mixed terrain surrounding the town and the total was boosted by around 50 walkers completing the Chapelton Trail for the charity.

Spectators also enjoyed live music, entertainment and catering whilst cheering on competing family members and friends.

Extensive progress in our building programme will now offer residents, potential buyers and neighbouring communities a range of new opportunities.

Single Storey Cottages

Following high demand from prospective buyers and local community feedback, a range of cottages set around courtyards are set to be added to Chapelton's street scene.

Led by housebuilder, Stephen, the new property types will offer a series of two and three bedroom homes available as both semi and detached homes. They are currently available for purchase off plan.

The single storey cottages have been designed to complement the existing mix of properties available in Chapelton and will bring a new dimension to the current landscape.

Retirement Village Plans

Elsick Development Company's vision of Chapelton as a stand-alone community that provides a more sustainable, whole-of-life alternative to suburban expansion will take a major step forward with plans for a retirement village within the town.

Supporting prospective buyers' varying needs, the village is set to offer a selection of one and two bedroom apartments and single storey cottages. The area will also provide open green spaces, landscaped communal gardens and a community hub.

Meet the Team

Galina Tachieva, Managing Partner at DPZ



Originally from Sofia, Bulgaria, Galina Tachieva works with new urbanism planning firm Duany Plater-Zyberk & Co (DPZ) helping to support Elisck Development Company bring the vision of Chapelton to life.

Her experience of working on projects across the world gives Galina great insight into the best practice in town planning, helping to make Chapelton a vibrant new community for the future.

How did you get to where you are today?

I came to the United States more than twenty years ago to study for my graduate degree in urban planning at the University of Miami's School of Architecture.

The course was overseen by Andres Duany and Elizabeth Plater-Zyberk from DPZ and after being incredibly impressed by the company's methodology of how to improve traditional urbanism, I applied for an internship. I've been here ever since and thoroughly enjoy what I do, bringing meaningful and beautiful projects to help communities thrive both physically and economically.

What does your typical day at work involve?

DPZ oversees projects across the world so I spend a lot of my time travelling. Besides Scotland I have travelled to Brazil, Mexico and Canada helping the company to progress their projects.

No day is ever the same but a lot of my job involves design and collaboration with stakeholders through a charrette process as well as research.

As a Managing Partner, I often oversee new work coming in, staff composition and the coordination of both long and short terms goals of the firm.

What does your role contribute to Chapelton?

In addition to leading projects and charrettes I also participate as a project manager and designer - this is the case with Chapelton.

Andres Duany leads the public process and meetings while I manage the design team with my partner. Chapelton is a very large project so we need all hands on deck to help.

What do you look forward to seeing develop the most in the town?

We designed Chapelton with a very picturesque urban structure, a bit like a medieval settlement. As a result, the town features a complex topography with multiple existing features or 'traces on the land' such as trees, roads and pathways. I'm really looking forward to seeing Chapelton develop whilst remaining sympathetic to its surroundings and retaining elements of traditional Scottish towns.

Can you contribute a fun fact that not everyone might know about you?

This is a story from many, many years ago. I have been an avid reader since childhood, and Oscar Wilde was my favourite in high school. I was happy to accept a role in his play "Lady Windermere's Fan" when it was staged with our senior class. Well, this was my first and last theatrical performance - I played Lady Windermere, the only "tragic" character in a comedy! And it was a real tragedy at the end - I was so bad. This experience taught me a good lesson - you have to try different things in life before finding your true vocation.
