Meet the Team

Alan Brown, Quantity Surveyor at Thomson Gray



Since joining the Elsick Development Company team in 2012, Alan Brown from construction consultant company Thomson Gray has closely advised the delivery of the core infrastructure of Chapelton. He tells ChapeltonNews how his role has developed and evolved with the progress of the town.

How did you get to where you are today?

I've always been interested in the construction sector and after completing a degree in quantity surveying at Edinburgh Napier University in the early nineties and gaining some experience, I joined Thomson Gray over ten years ago. I now work on a wide variety of projects across Scotland and as far afield as Italy.

What does your role contribute to Chapelton?

At Thomson Gray we offer both cost and procurement advice on the core infrastructure of the Chapelton landscape. As the project has progressed the advice that we provide has become much wider and now includes all aspects such as a the road network and community facilities.

What other projects have you worked on in addition to Chapelton?

I've worked on a number of infrastructure projects in recent years but prior to this I was mainly involved in conservation works. I have been involved in a number of projects at Blair Castle, New Lanark World Heritage Site and the complete restoration of Marchmont House, a stately home in the Scottish Borders.

Do you have a favourite element in Chapelton?

I remember my first visit to Chapelton and seeing the bare fields set to be developed alongside my drawing plans and now it's really exciting to see this in place. A real highlight was cycling down Greenlaw Road as part of the Chapelton Bike Ride last year - it was such a great feeling to see the town full of people and life.

How do you like to spend your free time?

I do a lot of cycling and like to get out into the hills surrounding the village where I stay whenever I can. With two young boys, most of my free time is spent with the family and we do a lot of swimming and canoeing in the summer.

Tell us something that not everyone might know about you.

I've never owned a CD or anything more modern than that for music. I have a large collection of LPs and regularly listen to my record player, preferably with a glass of something red.
