Meet the Team

Philip Lucey from Turner & Townsend



How does your work benefit the Chapelton community?

I play an integral role in the management and delivery of the design works and construction works at Chapelton. Taking direction from the strategic decision makers, I am very closely linked to the design stages and the delivery of the construction project on the site. I share all key project information between both the construction team and the design team. Being delivery focused, we are always learning and are always aiming to improve on the previous experience in order to strive to improve the environment for the Chapelton community.

How did you reach your current role?

I graduated from the University of Dundee in 2011 with a Masters degree in Civil Engineering with Design and Management. I began my professional career with an engineering consultancy based in Aberdeen. During this time I worked on a range of civil engineering projects experiencing a wide variety of demands. When an opportunity to work with Turner & Townsend arose, I was delighted to move into the project management role.

Describe to us what a regular day at work looks like.

My days at work can vary greatly. Depending on the particular demands of the job at any given time, it can be spent in the office dealing with the drafting of contracts and contract administration work to reviewing drawings with multi-discipline design teams to liaising with key contractors on the construction sites and even sometimes getting my hands dirty on site!

What, to date, has been your best memory of Chapelton?

The build up to the Chapelton Bike Ride 2017; after a particularly tough year in the local economy during the period of 2016, 2017 has proven to be a busier year for Chapelton. After working closely with the design teams on many aspects of the job during late 2016, the Stage two infrastructure contract was let in April of 2017.

Since then the various teams involved have been working hard to deliver critical completions for the bike ride. This has been combined with the formal introduction of a new stakeholder to the site in Liberty Retirement Living who will be delivering the retirement village. The time period between letting the contract in April 2017 to the launch of Liberty on site and the bike ride on September 3rd demanded a very tight construction programme from WM Donald which came with its challenges. The design and construction teams have worked exceptionally well in order to deliver what was necessary in a short period of time. This is something I look back on, on behalf of the continued development of Chapelton, with great satisfaction.

What do you think makes a good home?

A close-knit community in which people feel comfortable with their neighbours and the wider residents. In addition to this, a local environment which provides great local amenities and the park space for the community to socialise and hold events in a nurturing environment make for a good home. Whilst Chapelton is in its infancy as a new town, it has already moved ahead with leaps and bounds to deliver what I consider to be an environment people truly want to call home. There are many exciting prospects to come in the future.

Can you tell us something that not everyone might know about you?

Having won many caps for the Scottish national team since the age of 16, I am also a former member of the Great Britain Under 25 full bore rifle team that won gold at the world championships at Connaught Ranges in Ottawa, Canada 2007.
