Five Things You Might Not Know About Chapelton

- The 2.4-mile long Chapelton trail incorporates part of the Causey Mounth. An old drovers' road, it was created as the main route between Stonehaven and the Bridge of Dee in Aberdeen over 800 years ago. What remains of the original path still acts as a causeway over boggy areas such as Portlethen Moss nature reserve.
- Hume Square in the centre of the town is named after the famous philosopher David Hume, who formulated the concept of empiricism.
- 3 The Liddell Hut is named in honour of Eric Henry Liddell; a Scottish Olympic Gold Medallist runner, Christian missionary and international rugby player. Liddell refused to run in heats for 100 metres race at the 1924 Summer Olympics as they were held on the Sabbath, and his exploits were brought to a bigger audience in the 1981 Oscar-winning film Chariots of Fire.
- 4 Chapelton itself takes its name from a small hamlet of a few houses located near Elsick House, giving the town a centuries-old link to the local area.



Chapelton's use of pedestrianised and public spaces is typical of a civic planning direction known as New Urbanism. Housing and shopping are placed in close proximity, with accessibility for all one of the main forces behind Chapelton's vision.
