What's on in Chapelton



The Chapelton events calendar is continuing to grow with upcoming months set to offer something for every age and interest. Read on to find out more about recent successful events and those that you're welcome to join in the near future.

Easter Egg Hunt

The 2019 Easter egg hunt was a sell-out success, with dozens of families searching the Chapelton walking trail to find clues hidden by the town's Easter Bunny.

The clues led to a final chocolatey prize whilst egg decorating and face painting took place in The Cabin. All proceeds from the event were donated to Abbie's Sparkle Foundation - a Scottish charity which supports children with cancer.

Chapelton IOK and Kids Fun Run

Following the success of last year's event, the Chapelton 10K is set to return on Sunday 14 July. With all proceeds donated to local charities, this is a day out for the whole family to enjoy whilst raising much needed funds for great causes.

Sponsored by Hall Morrice, with adult medals provided by WM Donald, the day starts at 10am with the children's race, sponsored by Brio Retirement Living and organised by Friends of Newtonhill.

It will be a 100m toddler dash for under 5s and a 1km race for primary school children. The main race will take runners through the beautiful grounds of Elsick House before finishing up in Chapelton.

Farmers' Market

Just one week on from the Chapelton 10K and Kids Fun Run and the town's first Farmers' Market will take place.

Hosted in Hume Square from 11am - 3pm on Sunday 21 July, this is a chance to celebrate the North East's great selection of produce by sampling food and drink from a range of suppliers. Hot food from Haydn's Woodfired Pizza and The Principled Pig will be available as well as a stalls including Bannerman Butcher, Bakery Lane, Cove Honey Bees, Sillyflatt Fare and The Bread Guy.





Chapelton Bike Ride and 5K Walk

The annual Chapelton Bike Ride and 5K Walk will return for its fourth year on 1 September. Sponsored by Burness Paull and Brio Retirement Living. The event will once again raise money for North East Sensory Services, a cause dedicated to helping blind and deaf people in the area to achieve independence.

Kicking off at 10:30am, the 42 mile bike ride will travel through Chapelton, Durris Forest and the village of Stonehaven. A shorter 12 mile route will start at 12pm with participants cycling through Chapelton's roads and pathways, and a 5km trail walk, sponsored by Brio Retirement Living, will begin just after 12pm.

Food and drink will be available to keep athletes fuelled whilst spectators can enjoy entertainment and stalls selling local crafts and bespoke jewellery.

Entries are priced at £15 for the 42 mile route and £5 for the 12 mile route. Entries of four people taking part in the 42 mile route will be reduced to £50 for the group and £15 for the 12 mile route. All preregistered riders will receive a free goodie bag.
