The Chapelton events calendar has been busy in recent months and as we move into the early stages of 2020 this is set to continue. Things have already got off to a great start with the first event of the year selling out in just a matter of days. Here, we round up some of the recent events and those still to come.

#### **Festive Farmers Market**

The final farmers market of 2019 had a festive twist with stalls boasting Christmas gift ideas, decorations and art. The Liberty Kitchen and Bannerman Butcher were also on hand to warm up attendees with local produce and hot food as they browsed.

#### **Christmas Lino Printing**

Attendees of this event learned the art of lino cutting alongside local business Juniper Press. Creating their own Christmas cards, envelopes and tags, visitors practiced traditional cutting techniques before taking home their own lino blocks to carry on the hobby in the future.

#### Christmas Lights Switch On

The local community gathered in Hume Square in early December to enjoy the annual lights switch on. Teacake served up takeaway soup whilst Slate & Grain opened for the occasion welcoming locals who had sung carols around the tree decorated with crafts handmade by children living in Chapelton as well as from local groups.


## Development Plans Continue Apace



This year will bring forward a significant new phase of building in Chapelton. The existing three housebuilders have been joined by two new firms, Scotia and Snowdrop, and all are working with Elsick Development Company to create a variety of new homes. Everyone is keen to continue to offer prospective buyers a range of detached, semi-detached and single storey properties as well as apartments.

With 175 new homes planned for the next stage the built area of the town is set to double in size. Over 140 properties are well underway through the planning process, with consent already granted for the first five homes to be built by Snowdrop. Applications for the remainder are expected to follow shortly.

Building work will take place per the diagram which shows the areas that the various companies will be working in.
