With the first farmers' market of the year being the biggest yet, we're excited to host farmers' markets on Sunday 18th July, Sunday 19th September and Sunday 21st November. The list of stallholders is forever growing, with visitors flocking to sample produce from across the North East.

August will see the return of the Scarecrow Festival organized by the allotment committee and promises to be even bigger and better this year. The annual Chapelton Bike Ride will return for its sixth year on Sunday 5th September. Sponsored by Burness Paull, the event will once again see cyclists trail across a 42 mile route or shorter 12 mile route to raise money for local charity North East Sensory Services.
