This summer has been our busiest yet in Chapelton for both residents and housebuilders. With life returning to a new normality, building onsite has been exceptionally busy with over 100 homes currently in the process of construction and the next phases planned out. Visitor numbers have increased with every passing week and the scarecrows were particularly popular, bringing in families from far and wide.

The biggest change to the landscape at Cairnhill has undoubtedly been The Boxes @ Chapelton. Introducing retail has been a long running desire of ours and it turned into a workable plan

in March. It is therefore a pleasure to have 10 new businesses in the town only six months later. All of them are occupied and there is a buzz about the place. Allowing small independent businesses to flourish has long been one of our aims and there is a community feel and excitement from all the retailers.

Following on from our exhibition in the spring, the design team have been busy working closely on the details for the neighbourhood centre at Cairnhill and we are encouraged at the interest in the retail and commercial for the next stages. This will also bring the construction works alongside the proposed school site surrounded by more community parks and allotments.

The range of events has been unprecedented and it heartens me to see that Chapelton residents, our own team and local charities have between them raised over £13,000 this year. The events have brought in many new faces and a sense of camaraderie. There are more planned in the run up to Christmas so it is worth keeping an eye on our social media pages.

Summer events were well supported. The events programme in Chapelton was bursting at the seams this summer with sporting events alongside lots of family fun and a comedy night too.

48 hour relay

39 local runners took part in two full days of continuous running for charity. An incredible 538km was clocked up by the team, raising over £3000 for local charities. The committee are working on the return of the live 10K event for 2022.
